

### **HEALTH AND WELLNESS**

- ACCESS TO A HEALTH CLINIC (FULL-TIME PHYSICIAN CARE ON-CAMPUS FOR STUDENTS)
- GATHERING AND PROVIDING INFORMATIONAL RESOURCES FOR STUDENTS SEEKING TO IMPROVE THEIR HEALTH AND WELL-BEING
- COLLABORATE WITH HEALTH AND WELLNESS STAKEHOLDERS TO IDENTIFY KEY GAPS IN HEALTH SERVICES FOR STUDENTS
- DEVELOP AN EMERGENCY FUND FOR STUDENTS IN URGENT NEED
- ADVOCATE FOR ISSUES PERTAINING TO STUDENT HEALTH AND WELLNESS AT THE UNIVERSITY, COMMUNITY, AND/OR GOVERNMENT LEVEL

### STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

- ESTABLISH REGULAR INTERACTION BETWEEN SRC AND THE STUDENT BODY, EXCLUDING SRC MEETINGS.
- CONSULT STUDENTS TO DEVELOP A STUDENT PROGRAMMING FRAMEWORK
- CONSULT STUDENTS ON ADVOCACY ISSUES TO GAIN STORIES AND FEEDBACK ON OUR INITIATIVES

# **ADVOCACY**

- CONDUCT RESEARCH AND DEVELOP POLICY POSITIONS ON STUDENT ISSUES
- DEVELOP WELL-RESEARCHED ADVOCACY PRIORITIES TO PRESENT TO THE UNIVERSITY
- INVITE STUDENT, UNIVERSITY, AND COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS TO PREPARE COLLABORATIVE ADVOCACY PROJECTS.

- DEVELOP A TRANSITIONS POLICY
- CREATE EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS FOR INCOMING SRC, EXEC, AND CHAIR/VICE CHAIR
- HOST AN EVENT WITH THE INCOMING AND OUTGOING TEAMS

## **COMMUNICATION AND VISIBILITY**

- ESTABLISH REGULAR COMMUNICATION WITH STUDENTS ON OUR PROGRESS TOWARDS GOALS
- ENSURE SRC MEETINGS ARE COMMUNICATED TO STUDENTS IN ADVANCE TO INVITE STUDENT INVOLVEMENT IN THE MEETINGS
- FACILITATE A REBRANDING PROCESS, INCLUDING LOGO, TYPEFACE, AND OTHER COMPONENTS OF UNIFORMITY
- UPDATE SRC ON CURRENT WORK AND DEVELOPMENTS TO INCREASE STUDENT OUTREACH BY WORD OF MOUTH
